

Sumatra I Leuser Nationalpark & Trekking

Be inspired by an excursion into pure nature leaving the hectic of daily life. The Leuser National Park is one of the richest tropical rainforests in Southeast Asia. Covering up to 7927 km2 and straddling the border of North Sumatra and Aceh provinces it is one of the last places on earth, where you can see the critically endangered Orang Utans in the wild. If you are really lucky, since there are very few still alive, you will encounter the Sumatran Tiger, Sumatran Elephant or the Sumatran Rhinoceros, and the legendary biggest bloom in the world - Rafflesia Arnoldii and Amorphophallus Titanium in their natural habitats during this expedition.

Day - 3 Bahorok Riverside

JAMUR BATU BAWAH - ARAS PINANG (B, L, D)

Breakfast near the river, you will continue to hike to **Aras Pinang**, passing small **ravines**, small **rivers**, and observing **wildlife** by the river banks. Usually **mammals** and **birds** are going to the area around the river in order to get enough **water supply**. (ca. 6 hours).
