

Sumatra I Leuser Nationalpark & Trekking

Be inspired by an excursion into pure nature leaving the hectic of daily life. The Leuser National Park is one of the richest tropical rainforests in Southeast Asia. Covering up to 7927 km² and straddling the border of North Sumatra and Aceh provinces it is one of the last places on earth, where you can see the critically endangered Orang Utans in the wild. If you are really lucky, since there are very few still alive, you will encounter the Sumatran Tiger, Sumatran Elephant or the Sumatran Rhinoceros, and the legendary biggest bloom in the world - Rafflesia Arnoldii and Amorphophallus Titanium in their natural habitats during this expedition.

Day - 4 Sungai Kerapu Riverside

ARAS PINANG – KERAPU RIVER (B, L, D)

After breakfast you will start your hike to **Sungai Kerapu** (ca. 6 hours). **Gunung Leuser National Park** holds an important role for **water cycle** in both in **Aceh** and **North Sumatra** province. On the **North Sumatra** side, there is **Sungai Wampu**, **Bahorok River**, **Sungai Kerapu** and other small rivers originally coming from **Gunung Leuser**. Sungai Kerapu is a **bigger river** than Sungai Landak. You may **swim**, or **walk**, or **fish** in the river. Overnight at the **temporary camp** at **Sungai Kerapu riverside**.
